Requested Research Paper Formatting Checklist

To help you apply the final touch to your research papers, we request that you ascertain that the following components have been completed. Your **Final Paper is due on December 7**, **2016**.

Content and Formatting

- 1. Include a **Cover-sheet** with **your title Centered** as well as your *Name*, *HUID#*, *Date*, *ENVR e-120 Environmental Ethics & Land Management*, *Status (e.g. Graduate, Undergraduate)*.
- 2. You have a table of Contents with your content, and associated paging.
- 3. **If** you have Figures, and Tables, you should have corresponding *List of Figures* and *List of Tables*. These will be placed within your paper at the appropriate place within your writing. (Not everyone will have a list of tables/figures). If you have additional relevant and pertinent information, consider an Appendix, at the end of your research.
- 4. Your work has been **double-spaced**.
- 5. You have used 1-inch margins.
- 6. Your **font-style** is something standard such as *Times* or *Arial*.
- 7. The **font-size** is **12** pt.
- 8. Although we support sustainable measures, use one side of the paper.
- 9. Number Pages, and put your Name on each page.
- 10. You have included a bibliography using a single correct citation style (e.g. APA is recommended, MLA is acceptable.). A standard bibliography is sufficient.
- 11. Your paper should not be in excess of 20 type-written pages of text for your argument. These 20 pages are non-inclusive of your bibliography; your bibliography will require additional pages.

- 12. Please **Proofread your paper**, and have a trusted friend proofread your paper.
- 13. Consider an appointment at the Harvard Writing Center to review your work.
- 14. **Spell-check** your work!
- 15. Always verify that your paper is not "talking" but you are as the author. (E.g. *This paper will analyze* or *this paper will explain* or *this paper will calculate....*). If your paper can actually do this, consider a patent!
