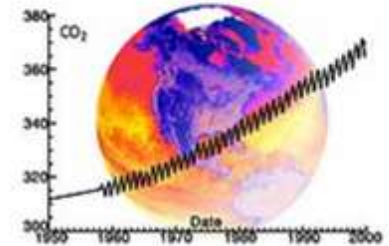
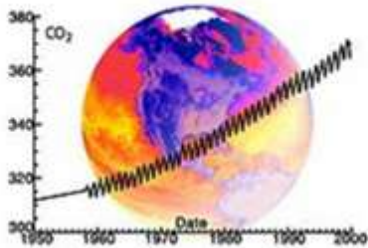

You can think of it as a critical article which assesses a particular problem and documents its major features, the principle people or groups involved and highlights specific policies that in your judgment need to be devised to address the problem.

The boldest plan to achieve the targets set by the 2015 Paris climate agreement comes from China. The Paris accord commits the world's governments to keep global warming to well below 2 degrees Celsius relative to the pre-industrial level. This can be accomplished mainly by shifting the world's primary energy sources from carbon-based fossil fuels (coal, oil, and natural gas) to zero-carbon, renewable (wind, solar, hydro, geothermal, ocean, biomass), and nuclear energy by the year 2050.

China produces more carbon dioxide emissions than any other country, and its coastal cities will be dramatically affected by rising seas as the atmosphere warms, according to a November [report](#) by Climate Central, a nonprofit organization.

Barring large amounts of spending on shoreline barriers and flood control systems, these images show what China would face if carbon emissions cause global temperatures to rise by **2° Celsius (3.6°F)**, the current international target by 2100, or by **4° Celsius (7.2°F)**, roughly the warming predicted if no action is taken to curb emissions.

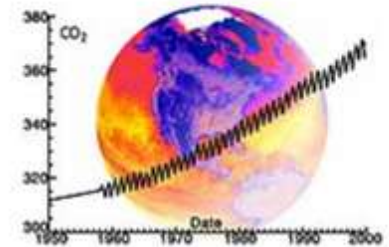
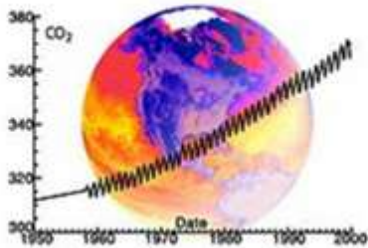
