
Changes in Ocean Currents

What about ocean currents and oceanatmosphere-land interactions?



What might Greenland melting do to the North Atlantic "Thermo-Haline Circulation" (THC) system?

The melt water from Greenland's glaciers might be disrupting the THC system, causing drought in the Mediterranean and wetter, colder weather further north in Europe.



The circulation of warm waters from the tropics toward the poles determines the "weather" over much of Earth. Any changes in this circulation can lead to abrupt changes in weather over time – ie. climate. The Asian monsoons need to be studied in addition to the north Atlantic THC system.



Paleo-climatologists (climate archeologists) are now finding evidence for an abrupt change in ancient climate leading to the simultaneous collapse of ancient Egypt and Mesopotamia

- perhaps related to a shift in the Atlantic THC system



Is the Earth's future in danger?

Human activities threaten the Earth's ability to sustain future generations, a survey into the state of the planet has concluded.

After a third sleepless night, climate negotiators in Durban, South Africa, finally found a way to reach a compromise early Sunday morning. The deal doesn't set hoped-for new targets to limit global warming, but delegates ultimately decided to embrace it rather than risk a major collapse of this international process.

Few people had high expectations for this year's annual round of United Nations climate talks. The main hope was to finalize an agreement reached in principle the year before — that is, establishing a major new fund to help funnel billions of dollars from rich nations to poor nations. That will help them adapt to a changing climate and to produce clean energy so they don't contribute so much to climate change

Bali COP 13 (2007) – first COP in the "Third World" raised concerns for Third World development and "developed world" assistance. U.S. opposes Third World position, is booed in plenary session and reverses its "official stance." Then retracts its commitment under President George W. Bush. U.S. insists on no targets or timetables for carbon emissions. Paupau New Guinea tell U.S. "either 'lead' or get out of the way."

In terms of the evolution of climate diplomacy, we need to keep in mind the progression from:

Copenhagen COP 15 (2009) – first COP for President Obama. Great expectations that he would reverse President Bush's hostile policies, but great disappointment when he offered nothing and meetings collapsed without accord. U.S. "blamed" China for 'lack of transparency.' China defends policy integrity of the Kyoto principle of "Common but differentiated responsibilities."

In terms of the evolution of climate diplomacy, we need to keep in mind the progression from:

Durban COP17 (2011) – first COP on African continent. Disputes continue between "global North" and "global South." India emerges as strong defender of "equity" to affirm the "common but differentiated" responsibilities – emphasizing the historical role of U.S. and Europe in creating emissions problem. The concept of "Climate Justice" emerges as a major demand of the NGO community – outside the talks. This becomes the theme of the global South.

In terms of the evolution of climate diplomacy, we need to keep in mind the progression from:

Paris COP 21 (2015) – 190 + nations agree to "voluntary limits" to be set by each country for themselves. No fixed timetable and no firm targets. Each country agrees to publish its own achievements and monitor its own progress on reducing GHGs. Scientists say the "agreement between nations" is a "fraud" because it cannot possibly achieve the reductions needed for the survival of civilization.
