

...and presented as an "Essay."


Remember, an essay is well documented presentation of a judgment or opinion on your part concerning a particular topic. You need to demonstrate how you arrived at this opinion by considering a variety of other opinions and sources of data that are clearly attributed and properly cited.

Necessary components of an adequate citation:

All proper citations of sources should include five (5) key elements:

- Author (or institution)
- "Title" (in "quotes" or bolded)
- Publication information, (Journal title, number, pages, etc).
- Date of publication or event
- Source locator ie. URL or DOI

- Develop your argument over 8 to 10 pages, with approximately 3 footnotes or endnotes per page in which you cite your sources.


